 - 13.1.2 We shall disclose in writing, upon request, the specific purpose for which we use, collect and store your personal information. We will also keep a record of that personal information and the specific purpose for which we have used it.
 - 13.1.3 We will not use your personal information for any purpose, other than that which we disclosed to you herein, unless you give us your express written permission to do so, or unless we are permitted/required to do so by law.
- 13.2 Further to the requirements of the ECT Act; we will disclose your personal information without your consent:
 - 13.2.1 If We are required to do so by law or a court order;
 - 13.2.2 if disclosure is in the public interest, and;
 - 13.2.3 with your express or implied consent.
- 13.3 In terms of the Consumer Protection Act and section 45 of the ECT Act, you understand that you have the option to opt out of any mailing list maintained by Al-Huda Legal for commercial and marketing communications.

14. Alternative dispute resolution

- 14.1 Subject to urgent and/or interim relief, all disputes regarding:
 - i) the inability to access the Website;

- shall be referred to arbitration in terms of the expedited rules of the Arbitration Foundation of South Africa and such arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in Johannesburg in English

- 14.3 The cooling-off provisions detailed in section 44 of the ECT Act may apply to the Services available on the Website
